BE PREPARED AND READY

Jesus is well known for telling parables. A parable reveals a truth in a way which is alive and vivid. He takes a story from everyday life and uses it to illustrate a greater truth. His parables often carried an element of surprise, a plot twist that we may not be ready for in order to change our ways of thinking or living. In the parable of the Workers in the Vineyard, all the workers were paid the same, even though some only



worked a short time. Instead of an economic discussion, Jesus reflected, "So those who are last now will be first then, and those who are first will be last."

Few weeks ago, we heard the parable of the Wedding Banquet. The original invited guests wouldn't come, so the Master sent his messengers out into the highways and byways to gather any who would come. But when the banquet hall was full of both good and bad, there was one who didn't have the wedding garment on, and he was cast out. Jesus surprised by ending that story with this statement: "For many are called, but few are chosen."

Today's gospel is about wedding parable concerning the five wise and five foolish virgins as part of the bridal party expecting the coming of the bridegroom. The wise had enough oil for their lamps, the foolish did not. The latter forgot something as simple and essential as spare oil. Lamps without oil served no purpose and became useless.

The oil represents something very significant that no Christian should be without. It is their preparation. The wise virgins were prepared because they had enough oil to get them through the night. The foolish virgins did not prepare well enough.

We soon come to the season of Advent, a season of our preparation for the return of Jesus. How should we prepare. Perhaps we should look at a man named Simeon. He was an old and godly man who is introduced to us in Luke. He had that type of steadfast endurance. The Lord had told Simeon that he would not die until he saw the Christ. He was getting quite old, but he was confident in the promise of God. One day, that promise was fulfilled in the twilight of his life.

May we be anointed with the oil of the Holy Spirit. It is He who makes sure our oil will not run out. Jesus is the Light of the World. It is He who will lead us home. But Jesus also says, "You are the light of the world." This can only happen if we are in Christ, and it is His light who shines through us. Let our lives shine as lamps.

32ND SUNDAY 2020 A REFLECTION ON **1ST THESSALONIANS 4:13**

In today's second reading from the first of Paul's letters, the old- Many who sleep in the dust est text in the New Testament, of the ground will awake to we read: "we want you to be Everlasting quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope." (1 Thess 4:13)



Some ancient Christian writers understood Paul to be saying here, "Don't grieve for the dead." Others, however, understood the verse to mean: "Grieve for the dead, but do so with hope." The second interpretation has won the day, after all, Jesus wept when he learned of Lazarus' death, and at the martyrdom of Stephen the Acts of the Apostles says that "devout men buried Stephen and made loud lamentation over him."

We grieve in hope because Christ has given death a new meaning. In the translation of our verse in our missals (The Jerusalem Bible translation) the deceased are described as "those who have died," but a more literal translation of the Greek "koimoenon," found in many other translations of this verse, refers to the deceased as "those who have fallen asleep."

Paul is not using 'sleep' as a euphemism for 'death' in order to diminish its harshness. He uses 'sleep' as a metaphor for 'death,' to convey that death is not final. And Christians soon would name burial places koimeteria. "sleeping places." The English word, 'cemetery' is clearly cognate with the Greek koimeteria.

One early Church Father, St John Chrysostom, commented that Christians appropriately called burial places "sleeping places," for "since Christ, no longer is death called death, but slumber and sleep." Thus in the Roman Canon or First Eucharistic Prayer we pray: "Remember Lord your servants who have gone before us with the sign of faith and rest in the sleep of peace."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church points out what is new about the Christian understanding of death when it says that death completes the process that began at Baptism: "Through Baptism, the Christian has already 'died with Christ' sacramentally, in order to live a new life; and if we die in Christ's grace, physical death completes this 'dying with Christ' and so completes our incorporation into him in his redeeming act." Thus, appropriately the Funeral Mass begins with "the recalling of Baptism."

Death is an evil. St Paul calls it the last enemy to be destroyed, so we mourn for those who have died, but we mourn with hope, for death has now a new meaning; "In death God calls us to himself." (Catechism 1011)

STRANGER St Dominic's "Welcoming the Stranger" proect has been in existence for nearly 7 years. Here are two of our good news stories. Our first family of 4 was from Syria, escaping from the war raging there. The parish was able to provide accommodation and support for over 2 1/2 years until they gained

permanent residency and are now Australian citizens and independent. They are very grateful to St Dominic's. In 2016 the parish provided accommodation for 2 adult Afghani sisters who had arrived by boat in Australia in 2012 after losing most of their family and applied for asylum here. We supported them with friendship, English help, computer literacy, budgeting, help with Centrelink interactions and assistance with living in Australian society. They then received a 5 year Safe Haven Enterprise visa. They now live outside of Brisbane. These are two of the families, parishioners of St Dominic's have been able to help.
