
"TRUST IN GOD, AND TRUST IN ME."

It is said that an optimist looks at a half glass of water and sees it half full. A pessimist, looking at the same glass, sees it half

empty. So, was Jesus an optimist? He says that his disciples will do "the works as I do, and will perform greater ones than these...." Is he serious? Was he just a wide-eyed optimist? Judging from the raw material Jesus had to work with, how could he make such a promise?

He is seated around the table with his disciples the night before he died and is confronted by his disciples' lack of understanding. Still, he tells them that they will do greater works than the ones they have seen him do. We might ask, "Where are these greater works Jesus promised

on our own powers.



believers would do? Maybe it is because we modern believers have not acknowledged God's power and have relied too much

Today Jesus tells us, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God still, and trust in me." Jesus was speaking to his disciples who had plenty of reasons to be troubled. It is the Last Supper and these are his farewell words to his disciples. They are not sure what the future holds for them, but it doesn't look good. One thing they do know, one thing they are sure of - whatever Jesus is speaking about is going to test their faith. Trouble and unrest are coming in ways they have never before experienced. Trouble and unrest - two unwelcome quests are about to disturb their lives.

What a bleak future for good people who had placed their trust in Jesus; people who had envisioned a completely different future for themselves. Jesus' words about his death troubled their hearts. Was there a future for them with this crisis coming upon them? How could they endure it? What would get them through

The troubles would be severe and the community would be scattered in fright. Still, Jesus asked his table companions, and he also asks us all today, "Trust in God and trust also in me."

Jesus' promise of his lasting presence with his followers wasn't just a promise for rosy, blissful times, but holds especially true in times of stress. Left by ourselves our faith would crumble. Think of the test our faith has endured during these years of suffering brought on by the clergy scandals, or this year by Coronavirus pandemic. Yet, if Jesus' life has taught us anything, it is that new life can come out of pain, even out of death.

5th SUNDAY EASTER YEAR A — REFLECTION

Each year during the last weeks of the Easter Season the Gospels draw on Jesus' Farewell Discourse at the Last Supper and they have similar themes: that Jesus, while returning to his Father, will remain with his disciples down through the ages, and that at his departure the Father will send the Holy Spirit to deepen the bond between Jesus and those who believe in him.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples that although he is returning to the Father he will remain with them as the Way, the Truth and the Life. Philip then asks Jesus to show him the Father. It is Jesus' response to Philip that I want to reflect on this morning: 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, "Show us the Father"?"

Jesus' reply to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father" reminds us, as Emeritus Pope Benedict said in a General Audience, that "Jesus ... does not merely speak of the Father but [he] is the Revelation of God." How can Jesus be the revelation of God? It is because he is God that he reveals God. We only know Jesus when we can say with Thomas Jesus, my Lord and my God.

The only Son has made the Father known through his humanity. As the first Preface of the Nativity of the Lord puts it: "in the mystery of the Word made flesh ... we recognise in him [Jesus] God made visible." Because the Word became flesh and dwelt among us we can say that God has a human face. It is Jesus. The Catechism puts it strikingly, "Christ's whole earthly life - his words and deeds, his silences and sufferings, indeed his manner of being and speaking - is Revelation of the Father. Jesus can say: "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father.""

Rightly, we contemplate Jesus as casting light on ourselves, that Jesus "reveals humankind to itself." In the words of the 2nd Vatican Council, "It is "only in the mystery of the Word made flesh that the mystery of humankind truly becomes clear." Jesus, as man, teaches us how to live in a fallen world, how to relate to each other and to his heavenly Father.

But such is the mystery of Jesus that he, as Word made flesh, reveals the Father. Thus Jesus' reply to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father," reminds us that while Jesus in his humanity, as true man, reveals to us our true selves, who we are called to be, it is in his divinity, as true God, he reveals the Father, and indeed reveals the Holy Spirit as the Gift of the Father and the Son. And as the Catechism has reminded us Jesus' "whole earthly life" revealed the Father.

In the season of Easter in contemplating Jesus' death and resurrection we also contemplate the Father and his love for us his wayward children revealed in Jesus, the human face of God.
