"ON THIS ROCK I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH."



Simon is the focus in today's reading. Jesus gives him his new name: he is Peter -Rock. Peter is given the key of authority and stewardship. Peter's confession comes at the end of Jesus' instruction to his disciples. In Peter, Jesus looks for what he needs in his disciples: a person committed to him by faith, ready to live out what Jesus has been teaching. Jesus has given Peter authority, which is a power to serve and not dominate. He will remind

Peter of that calling when he chooses to wash his disciples' feet and begins with Peter. It is only after Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection - which at first Peter rejects that Peter finally comes to understand his proper role.

Jesus gives Peter "the keys of the kingdom of heaven." God looks for responsible and faithful servants for the role of leadership over God's people. Like Peter and the first disciples, the institutional church has had great accomplishments and also made major mistakes in its history. Just as Peter's faith collapsed under the tests of Jesus' suffering and death, so too human weakness has been present in the institutional church. Our church will continue to manifest its human weaknesses, but in its holy members it will also be a sacramental sign of Christ's presence in our midst. In Christ, God has chosen to work with us and through us, despite our failings – which unfortunately show themselves at all levels of our church.

Like Peter we are followers of Jesus. Like him, we sometimes have deep insight and, at other times, a lack of faith. What Jesus saw in Peter he sees in us. Jesus did not find such faith in the Pharisees and so he looked to Peter and his band of followers. They and we are the ones called to take the gospel into the world.

Our faith enables us to say "no" to other allures and powers because Jesus has given his life to us his community. We are those who have accepted him as "the Christ, the Son of the Living God." We place our hope on his promise: the world that rejects him and propagates evil will not triumph. His goodness will prevail.

When Peter was tested, he faulted. That should give us encouragement because, just as Jesus did not give up on him, he will not give up on us when we falter. God's grace can help us overcome the obstacles to discipleship we face daily. Our God works in inscrutable ways; God uses the weak to accomplish God's plans for humanity. In doing that we know God must be the source of any success we have in helping further the reign of God.





21st SUNDAY YEAR A—REFLECTION



Today's second reading is Paul's hymn of praise that witnesses to God's unfathomable riches, wisdom and counsel, revealed in his sending his Son and the Holy Spirit to redeem and wayward renew his creation which has

comprised the subject matter of the first eleven chapters of Paul's Letter to the Romans, now brought to a conclusion with this prayer. Over the following three Sundays we will continue with readings from the final chapters of Paul's letter that deal with some ethical matters that Paul wanted to raise with the Christian community in Rome.

The hymn's last line, "From him and through him and to him are all things. To him be the glory forever. Amen." might sound familiar as it has shaped the doxology or hymn of praise of the Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass, "Through him, and with him, and in him, O God almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, forever and ever. Amen." Thus, in a way Paul's prayer has become with each celebration of the Eucharist our prayer.

We meditate on Paul's prayer in a time of pandemic. In last Saturday's Herald Sun I read the account of Tina Dinh's experience of falling ill with Covid 19: "I just remember lying there being scared, really scared. I was completely alone and I didn't understand what was happening to me. ... I could not breathe. The only thing I looked forward to every day ... they would ... hold my hand. That was the only contact ... and the only reminder that you are still here."

The young Vietnamese woman's experience reminded me of an incident in Matthew's Gospel. Jesus and his disciples were on the Sea of Galilee. A mighty storm sprang up and even a seasoned fisherman such as Peter became fearful and approached Jesus who was asleep in the boat. "Lord save us we are perishing." But Jesus questioned Peter and the others, almost certainly taking Peter by surprise, "Why are you afraid?" It seems Jesus was inviting them to trust him in the midst of the storm. It was one thing to trust him to still the storm. It was another to trust him in the storm. And that explains Jesus' response to Peter's plea.

It is in the storms that threaten to overwhelm our lives that Jesus invites us to trust in him and so be able to pray with Paul, "O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgements and how inscrutable his ways! 'For who has known the mind of the Lord?"
