"ANYONE WHO LOSES HIS LIFE FOR MY SAKE WILL FIND IT."

It is a wonder people do not get up and walk out of church hearing today's gospel. Jesus is advising his disciples that "Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me." As for the rest of us, Jesus' opening words today certainly sound offensive. At best, some members of the congregation might just

shrug their shoulders and say to themselves, "I don't get it!" or "What's going on here?"

What Jesus says sounds like he is saying that if we accept his invitation to follow him it will cost us. We might even be



rejected by our family and circle of friends. Those who were turning to Jesus and his ways would appear to be turning their backs on family. If our relatives embrace a lifestyle and values contrary to Jesus, our turning towards him would feel like abandoned to our family.

In Jesus' Mediterranean world membership in family gave a person their identity. Apart from family a person did not exist. So, to choose Christ would cut one off from one's family and the identity derived from membership in the clan. Accepting the invitation to follow Christ would give a person a new type of family – a family of disciples, not of blood relatives. It does not mean every Christian has to pack up and leave family but, for some, it might. What would happen to a person's identity then without a family? He or she would take on a new identity as a baptized Christian, belong to a new family and be called by a new family name – "Christian." The costs of discipleship might mean detachment from one's previous world and way of living. Jesus is asking total loyalty to him. Anything within ourselves, or with those we love, which might create a split in loyalties, must be put aside in favour of Christ.

The disciples at this point probably would wonder why Jesus is so concerned with persecution. But Jesus is preparing them beforehand for the much tougher conditions which would come after His death and resurrection when they would go out also to the Gentile areas.

Jesus commands the disciples to take up their crosses and follow Him. This was a first hint. What was going to happen to Him would also happen to them. They would be rejected even as He was going to be rejected. They too, would be put to death for following Jesus Christ.

A REFLECTION FOR THE 13th SUNDAY A 2020



Today's Gospel continues Jesus' discourse aimed at preparing the Twelve for their initial participation in his own ministry. While its immediate reference is to the first mission of the Apostles it relates to the life of the Church down through the ages. Thus it

shaped both St Dominic's and St Francis' understanding of their own and their orders' apostolate. In this light we see today's Gospel as an opportunity to reflect on how the Church understands its mission today, especially as it relates to the lay faithful.

First of all the Church sees itself as carrying on the mission of our risen Lord. In the words of Vatican 11, "The Church intends but one thing: to carry forward the work of Christ under the guidance of the befriending Spirit." (Church in the Modern World, 3) That is a basic insight into the Church.

The work or mission of Christ is briefly described in Vatican 11's Decree on the Laity thus: "Christ's redemptive work, while essentially concerned with the salvation of humankind, includes also the renewal of the whole temporal order." Its mission is both "to bring to all people the message and grace of Christ and to penetrate and perfect the temporal order with the spirit of the gospel" (Apostolate of the Laity, 5).

Thus Pope Saint John Paul 11 could say "If the Church makes herself present in the defence of, or in the advancement of man, she does so in line with her mission, which, although it is religious and not social or political, cannot fail to consider man in the entirety of his being."

The role of the lay faithful is to share in the whole mission of the Church. Thus while the clergy's primary role is to preach, celebrate the sacraments and be pastoral leaders the laity are also called to witness to Christ. A Council document could say that the laity "exercise an apostolate of evangelizing and sanctifying" (Apostolate of the Laity, 6), its ministry complementing the clerical ministry. An obvious example - it was because of my parent's faith that I was baptized and it was they who nurtured my faith by their example and teaching.

As well, the laity are called to witness to Christ by renewing in the Spirit of the Gospel the temporal order by "transforming the world from within." What this means has been further spelt out in the Council's document on the laity (Apostolate of the Laity, 2) "Since the laity, in accordance with their state of life, live in the midst of the world and its concerns, they are called by God to exercise their apostolate in the world like leaven, with the ardor of the spirit of Christ."

The clergy's apostolate also includes the temporal order, in one way, for instance, by teaching and promoting social justice, so they too are involved in the whole ministry of the Church in a way that complements the mission of the laity.

Thus let us approach today's Gospel with confidence that through the Holy Spirit it will help us reflect on the way we participate in the mission of the Church in the service of our times.


