## **THE COST OF DISCIPLESHIP**



Last Sunday Jesus blessed Peter and gave him authority over his mission to build the household of God. Things have turned quickly on Peter as now Jesus calls him a devil and pushes him off. The sound of his rejection reminds us of what Jesus said to the devil when he tempted Jesus in the desert, "Get behind me, Satan!" You can't blame Peter for trying to save his master from pain and death. But

there is more involved than just a devoted disciple's desire to protect the teacher he loves and follows. Christianity is not an easy walk, all smiles and good feelings.

Peter should have known better, after all, he's following the prophet Jesus. If Peter had reflected over the history of his religion, he would have remembered how prophets got rejected and killed. This is what Peter is facing: he is being called to accept a prophetic role and it will cost. "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let he renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me."

If we choose to follow Christ we will live lives based on a different set of values from what guides those around us. This choice will cost us - friends, family, popularity and even possessions. We cannot buy into the values of our culture without first passing them under the lens of the gospel. At first Peter does not accept the terms of the relationship Jesus is offering. The emphasis on the pain and sacrifice seems to have blocked his ears to what comes along with the cross. Peter will, Jesus promises, gain his life.

"Get behind me, Satan!" It's an initial rejection, Jesus is also telling Peter to go back where disciples should be - behind and following Jesus. That's the right place for us too, despite our repeated failures to live up to being Jesus' disciples. Like Peter, in subtle or more obvious ways, we have rejected the cost of discipleship and admit today our need for another chance to keep trying.

We are invited back where we belong - following Jesus. Along with other disciples we will be guided by Matthew over the next weeks as we listen to Jesus' teachings. We disciples will notice on our journey with Jesus how he daily accepts his cross; the rejection and slander thrown in his path on the road to Jerusalem. As always, Jesus offers forgiveness for wayward and even obstructing disciples. Jesus sees in us what he saw in Peter, a willingness to do the best we can to follow him, even unto death. And so we join Peter as we get behind Jesus and follow him to Jerusalem.

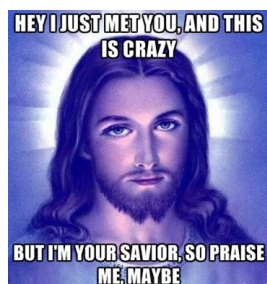

## 22nd SUNDAY YEAR A—REFLECTION



I want to reflect on the verse of today's reading from St Paul, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies [namely, one's life in all its dimensions] as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your

spiritual worship."

As Paul begins the section of his Letter to The Romans about ethical matters he describes the moral life of the Christian in language used to illustrate worship. Daily life Paul tells us is 'spiritual worship' or a 'living sacrifice'. He is not alone in this. St Peter refers to the Christian community as a living temple, and its sacrifice as the upright lives of its members who offer their sacrifice through Jesus Christ: "Like living stones be yourselves built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 2: 5).

Thus one commentator points out that Paul modifies the language of cultic worship in order "to convey that ... obedience to God's ways is a fundamental expression of authentic worship." So when we are committed to God's will, for the most part discovered in discerning the responsibilities of our personal vocation, our daily life itself becomes worship.

The Christian community over time saw in Paul's teaching a link to the Eucharist. One of the great figures of the early Church, Saint Cyprian of Carthage [200 AD – 258 AD,] who lived at a time of persecution, eventually becoming a martyr himself, in a letter to a group of clergy and lay faithful sentenced to slave labor in the mines of Numidia (modern day Algeria) sought to console them when he reminded them that although they could not celebrate the Eucharist they were nevertheless "celebrating and offering a sacrifice to God". He remarked, "You have become yourselves sacrificial offerings to God, you are presenting yourselves as holy and unspotted victims." He then quoted today's text from St Paul about presenting one's life "as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God".

We can relate the worship of daily life to the Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church's first reminds us that "in the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ also becomes the sacrifice of the members of his Body." It then goes on to link our daily lives to Christ's sacrifice, "The lives of the faithful, their praise, sufferings, prayer, and work, are united with those of Christ and with his total offering, and so acquire a new value." In the Eucharist we join in Jesus' self-offering, and we offer ourselves with him.

At a time of pandemic when most are deprived of the Eucharist Paul's reading, especially when seen in the light of St Cyprian's letter to Christians deprived of the Eucharist, has particular relevance, reminding us that the upright life of the Christian remains always "a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God".
