#### INVITATION TO PRAYER


The priest invites the congregation to pray:

#### SONG OF FAREWELL

As the body of Kevin is honoured with holy water (recalling his baptism) and incense (a mark of honour and symbol of our rising prayer), the friars will sing the responsory **O Spem Miram**, which recalls St Dominic's promise to his brethren that he would be of more use to them after his death than in life:
